NOTICE OF 45-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

DRAFT CLOSURE PLANS FOR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY AND RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS HANDLING FACILITY SANTA SUSANA FIELD LABORATORY, VENTURA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA 91307

Public Comment Period: August 13, 2018 to September 27, 2018

WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED? The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to comment on the draft Closure Plans (Plans) for the United States Department of Energy (DOE) Hazardous Waste Management Facility (HWMF) and Radioactive Materials Handling Facility (RMHF) at the Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL), Ventura County, CA 91307. The HWMF and RMHF are administered by DOE, and are in SSFL's Area IV. DOE is responsible for demolition and cleanup within Area IV. The HWMF Plan addresses Building T029 (e.g., B029) used to store alkali metals, and Building T133 (e.g., B133) used for the treatment of alkali metal waste. The RMHF occupies 1.5 acres of land and includes 10 buildings, structures and a paved area. The RMHF Plan addresses a subset of these buildings: Buildings 4021, 4022, 4621, and the Mixed Waste Storage Yard. The Plans primarily address building decommissioning and demolition activities, and propose addressing subsequent soils and groundwater investigation and cleanup in accordance with the 2010 Administrative Order on Consent for Area IV soils investigation and cleanup, and the 2007 Consent Order for groundwater investigation and cleanup.

DTSC will consider public comments for both draft Plans. DOE will implement each Plan if it is approved by DTSC. Implementation of the final Plans is contingent on DTSC finalizing its Program Environmental Impact Report, as required under the California Environmental Quality Act, and DOE finalizing their Environmental Impact Statement as required under the National Environmental Policy Act.

DTSC encourages your participation in the decision-making process. Before making a final determination on the Plans, DTSC will respond in writing to all public comments received during the public comment period. A Response to Comments document will be provided to all those who submitted public comments and to those who request a copy. A copy of the Response to Comments will also be placed in the information repositories for public review.
